
Glenelm Neighbourhood Association (GeNA)



We enjoyed two fascinating presentations from guest speakers Anna Marie Geddert, who spoke on the art of neighbouring and gave us many ideas on how to build stronger relationships with our fellow residents, and Dr. Richard Westwood, who spoke on Dutch Elm Disease and other threats to our urban canopy.

GLENELM SNOW SCULPTURE CHALLENGE

This was a fun event to encourage people to get outside and connect with neighbours - even deep into the minus temperatures. We worked with local businesses to sponsor the event, arranged a judging panel, and gave out hot chocolate and prizes.
